
# Vale Arthur Templeton 10.09.1925 —24.12.23

Arthur Templeton, dapper man and champion eye-twinkler, passed away peacefully at Buckland House.

Born in New Zealand, Arthur married a champion ball-room dancer and they loved to dance at competition level. His favourite dance was the suave Latin American styles, especially the tango.

## Vale Keith Pearce; a great friend of Buckland House 25.04.1942—30.11.23

Keith was a Melbourne man, but also had many fond memories of Bendigo. His family were early pioneers of the district; and were of Cornish mining heritage. A plumber by trade and a man of strong faith, Keith felt the call to become a missionary to help people in the places of most need. This took him to Papua New Guinea as well as many countries of the South Pacific. He assisted reconstruction after cyclones and tsunamis; rebuilding homes and village wells after inundation by seawater. He became part of those communities, loving the people and singing with them in church.

In later years, Keith moved to Tolmie to be of support to his sister, Norma. They both enjoyed the country, and together built a house that would allow them to stay there as long as possible. Wheelchair access was created, and this enabled the residents of Buckland to visit Keith and Norma in Tolmie over many years. We would have afternoon tea on the verandah, overlooking the ducks and the kangaroos relaxing by the dam.

We will miss you Keith; truly one of nature's gentlemen.

### Vale Jim Tisdale

### 9.2.1934-18.12.2023

Jim was born in Mansfield in the tough times of the Thirties, and had memories going back to the age of charcoal fuel. His earliest occupations were tied to the history of our region. Like his Dad he mined for gold at A-1; he also fixed cars with Hoot Gibson. In the early days of travelling country cinemas Jim delivered film reels for picture shows at the A-1, Woods Point, Jamieson, and Tolmie.

In later years Jim bought his own Man truck, and transported to the Fort Headland and Pilbara areas of Western Australia.

He loved the outdoors, caravanning and fishing locally and at a favourite spot in Porepunkah. A good community man, Jim played piano and piano-accordion for the dances at Gaffney's Creek Hall.

Jim is survived by his beloved wife Iris, and children Sharon and Greg.
